Parolees to come to our neighborhood in high numbers....

Dr. John Klofas, RIT Chair of Criminal Justice who works in the fields social sciences and criminal justice put together a report last year that informs that 235 parolees were integrated into the 14621 zip code neighborhood in 2008. This was a much higher number that went into our neck of the woods than any other City neighborhood according to his study.

During an interview on May 18th with Mayor Duffy on Channel 8, he viewed it as a very high number as well and that his administration would have to investigate as to why the State is sending this high amount of parolees into our neighborhood. Though this type of investigation we will be able to find out where many were before being assigned to the neighborhood.

The truth of the matter is and it could very well be that many of the parolees have roots already in this neighborhood and that our main focus should be on the re-entry into community process of said parolees.

There are initiatives such as "The Education Challenge & Prison Re-entry" *From School House to Jail House* by Trinity Emmanuel Presbyterian Church here in the City of Rochester that was just recently took place.

Many residents are concerned with this trend and the hope is that we as a community can encourage the proper re-entry back into community life as productive members of society. □

From the Executive Directors desk....

Vision, vision and more vision! We are on our way at looking at another avenue in our immediate neighborhood. Portland Avenue is the selected one as a result of some local residents and concerned citizens coming together because of a shared idea that a co-op grocery store is greatly needed in this underserved area.

We have had some studies and actual development done on some of our major arteries as a result of the investment of time and efforts put forth by many of our community folks. Let's take a look at some of these initiatives:

- St. Paul Revitalization Project completed in the early 2000's has brought a nice streetscape characteristics from Upper Falls Blvd, traveling north to Norton St. where we have a fish engraved in the intersection to depict Seth Green Fish Hatcheries, which was the first of its kind in the nation.
- Joseph Avenue has also received a streetscape uplift enhancing its lighting, street curve appeal, traffic control measures and even on street parking improvements from the downtown area moving north to Avenue D.
- Hudson Avenue has completed a first phase corridor study where a commercial analysis was done, which is now waiting on funding to move to a second phase to identify future development opportunities and improvements to existing streetscape.
- North Clinton Avenue has recently received allocated funding for the "La Avenida" project which will enhance lighting, street curve appeal, traffic control measures and even on street parking improvements from the Upper Falls Blvd., area moving north to Avenue D. There will be some improvements to the Don Samuel Torres Park as well.
- Conkey Avenue, which is a high residential area, will have new residential-rental construction coupled with the creation of a walking, running and bike trail called "El Camino-Butter hole Trail".

So now with the Portland Avenue visioning session we, as a community, should be able to identify the social-economic issues that will give us the needs assessment, strategies and goals to pursue to improve the façade and streetscape qualities of this area.

As we say in the world, this is where the rubber meets the road or better yet, is the rubber meeting the road with some of these projects?

The 14621 zip code is a very large area which comprehends approximately 300 or more acres and about 80-85% is residential. So, if we are working on the main arteries and not paying close attention to the tributaries that feed those arteries they may dry up or die.

For those of you who know the above mentioned avenues, the challenges we face are, how to we keep sustainability to bring completed projects to fruition? And how do we integrate improvements to the residential infrastructure to complement those projects to create a sound and viable plan to improve neighborhoods and not commercial strips only?

The visioning sessions for projects are the key to assure that all the stakeholders are at the table so that all ideas are entertained. It is up to the folks who live, work and play in these neighborhoods to keep their eyes and ears open to neighborhood planning opportunities. For it is through this method that we can assure ourselves that, not only, immediate needs are being met, but that we can forecast as to what will make sense to implement in the futures.

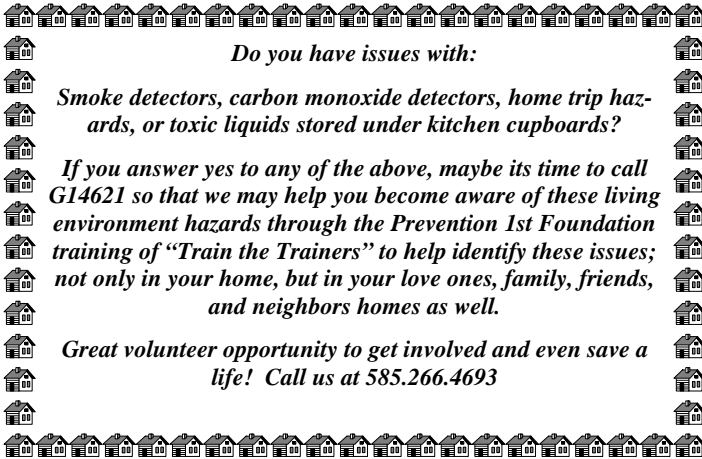
